The Board of Commissioners of the County of Fremont, State of Colorado, met in Regular Session on January 22nd, 2013, 615 Macon Avenue, Room LL3, Fremont County Administration Building, Cañon City, Colorado. Commissioner Chairman Debbie Bell called the meeting to order at 9:30 A.M.

The Morning Prayer was given by Pat Fish of the Vineyard Church.

Those present recited the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Commissioner Payne moved to approve the agenda. Commissioner Norden seconded the motion. Upon Vote: Commissioner Payne, aye; Commissioner Norden, aye; Commissioner Bell, aye. The motion carried.

CONSENT AGENDA

Commissioner Bell noted the scheduling of a Public Hearing on February 26, 2013 at 10:00 a.m. for consideration of an Amendment to the Fremont County Subdivision Regulations. A copy of the proposed Amendment will be available on the website.

Commissioner Norden moved to approve the consent agenda. Commissioner Payne seconded the motion. Upon vote: Commissioner Norden, aye; Commissioner Payne, aye; Commissioner Bell, aye. The motion carried. Resolution #7 and Resolution #8 are attached.

ADMINISTRATIVE/INFORMATIONAL

1. Administrative and Elected Officials

Pat McFarland, Fremont County Treasurer and Public Trustee presented the Treasurer's Semi-Annual Report. She said all departments were in the black at the end of the year. Tax statements were mailed out last Friday. She hopes the ability to pay property taxes on line will be available today. The system also allows people to view their tax information on line. Title Companies can print Tax Certificates on line if they have an escrow account set up with the Treasurer's Office. Commissioner Bell commended McFarland for the efforts her office has taken to be more accessible to the public.

Pat McFarland explained the Public Trustees Quarterly Report to the Board. Total Foreclosures for the year were 295. Total Releases were 545 for the year. Total fees collected were \$38,623.49. The expenses were \$16,382.79 leaving a fourth quarter income of \$22,240.70.

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The ending balance as of December 31, 2012 was \$115,288.51 about \$5,000 more than the previous year. Commissioner Norden asked if new legislation is being proposed this year for Public Trustees. McFarland said there is one possible change that may concern the Board and she will keep them informed.

Commissioner Norden moved to accept the Fremont County Treasurer's Semi-Annual Report and the Public Trustee's Quarterly Report for the fourth quarter of 2012. Commissioner Payne seconded the motion. Upon Vote: Commissioner Norden, aye; Commissioner Payne, aye; Commissioner Bell, aye. The motion carried.

Mike Cox, Fremont County Building Official, presented his year-end report for 2012. There were 729 total building permits issued in 2012. This represents a total construction valuation of \$20,051,599.70 for the year, an increase from 2011. There were 1,912 inspections performed in 2012. There were no appeals filed in 2012, however the mandatory meetings were held by the Board of Appeals. The 2012 budget was \$257,277 and expenditures were \$244,628.38. This leaves a surplus of \$12,648.62 due to an unfilled employee position. Total revenues were \$256,507.82.

Commissioner Norden announced the Board of County Commissioners is accepting letters of interest for the 4H Sales Committee for the annual junior livestock auction. The Committee will serve under the Fair Board. Letters of interest must be received by 4:00 p.m. on January 31, 2013.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Consideration of a Resolution recognizing Betty Hanawalt, Fremont County Veteran's Service Officer for her more than five years of service to Fremont County.

Commissioner Norden read Resolution #9 into the record. The Commissioners presented the Resolution to Betty Hanawalt. Resolution #9 is attached.

2. Resolution appointing the Fremont County Veteran's Service Officer.

Commissioner Norden moved to appoint Albert Augustine as the new Fremont County Veteran's Service Officer effective February 3, 2013 through January 7, 2014 as Resolution #10. Commissioner Payne seconded the motion. Upon Vote: Commissioner Norden, aye; Commissioner Payne, aye; Commissioner Bell, aye. The motion carried. Resolution #10 is attached.

3. Consideration of a Resolution recognizing January 21, 2013 as John C. Fremont Day.

Commissioner Bell read Resolution #11.

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Commissioner Payne moved to approve Resolution #11 recognizing January 21, 2013 as John C. Fremont Day. Commissioner Norden seconded the motion. Upon Vote: Commissioner Payne, aye; Commissioner Norden, aye; Commissioner Bell, aye. The motion carried. Resolution #11 is attached.

Commissioner Norden said he and Commissioner Bell were able to obtain two portraits of John C. Fremont that they had presented at the celebration yesterday. Commissioner Norden and Commissioner Payne unveiled these portraits which will remain on display in the Board Meeting Room.

Mary Chamberlain, Carol McNew and Margaret Stiles-Storm of the Fremont County Heritage Commission discussed their accomplishments in 2012 and goals for 2013.

4. Consideration of bid award to The Aggregate Source for Class 6 Road Material. Representative: Gary Weirton, Fremont County Department of Transportation

Gary Weirton said The Aggregate Source has the best product for their needs and has been supplying road base for a long time to the Department of Transportation. The bid is for \$2.85 per ton for a total of \$28,500 for 10,000 tons of Class 6 road base. This is for use in Eastern Fremont County.

Commissioner Payne moved to approve the bid award to The Aggregate Source in the amount of \$28,500. Commissioner Norden seconded the motion. Upon Vote: Commissioner Payne, aye; Commissioner Norden, aye; Commissioner Bell, aye. The motion carried.

5. Consideration of bid award to Kagan and Sons, LLC for Road Base. Representative: Gary Weirton, Fremont County Department of Transportation.

Gary Weirton said Kagan and Son is their only source for the Oak Creek area. The bid is for \$5.00 per ton for 6,000 tons of Class 6 road base.

Commissioner Norden moved to approve the bid award to Andy Kagan & Sons for \$30,000. Commissioner Payne seconded the motion. Upon Vote: Commissioner Norden, aye; Commissioner Payne, aye; Commissioner Bell, aye. The motion carried.

6. Consideration of Water Lease Agreement between Board of County Commissioners of Fremont County and the Upper Arkansas Water Conservancy District. Representative: Curtis Stone, Fremont County Department of Transportation.

Curtis Stone said they are trying to secure their water source for the summer season. The lease is for \$772 to buy two acre feet of water from the Upper Arkansas Water Conservancy District. There are five different draw locations. The evaporation rate is approximately 7-10% at each location.

Commissioner Norden moved to approve the Water Lease Agreement between Fremont County and the Upper Arkansas Water Conservancy District for \$772. Commissioner Payne seconded the motion. Upon Vote: Commissioner Norden, aye; Commissioner Payne, aye; Commissioner Bell, aye. The motion carried.

7. Consideration of a Building Waiver Request from the Tallahassee Volunteer Fire Protection Inc. to use a potable water cistern system for the Fire Station 1 building project. Representative: Gordon Grosslight, Fire Chief, Tallahassee VFP.

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Gordon Grosslight explained five acres of land were donated to them by the Rideouts along Highway 9. The plan is to build a main station to house truck operations and meetings. The water in this area requires treatment. Mr. Rideout will not go through with the land transfer if he is required to drill a well. The Fire Department has secured enough money to build the fire station. They are requesting a waiver of the current requirement to attempt to drill a well. The facility will have a bathroom with shower facilities for decontamination purposes. The facility will not have living quarters but will have a kitchen. The cistern would be 2000 gallons. They will have their own access to the state highway and will have signage in place.

Commissioner Norden moved to approve the Building Waiver Request exempting the Tallahassee Volunteer Fire Protection Inc. from the regulations requiring an attempt to drill a well and allowing the potable water cistern system. Commissioner Payne seconded the motion. Upon Vote: Commissioner Norden, aye; Commissioner Payne, aye; Commissioner Bell, aye. The motion carried.

8. Consideration of a Waiver and Indemnity Agreement with Robert Olislagers to conduct a Peer Review Airport Security Assessment at the Fremont County Airport. Representative: Dick Baker, Airport Manager.

Dick Baker said the Airport Board was concerned with security issues at the airport. The Airport Board is requesting an independent review of the airport and the security plan. The agreement is with Robert Olislagers of Centennial Airport Authority in Denver. This service is being offered free of charge. The agreement has been reviewed by Brenda Jackson.

Commissioner Payne moved to approve the Waiver and Indemnity Agreement and authorize the Chair to sign. Commissioner Norden seconded the motion. Upon Vote: Commissioner Payne, aye; Commissioner Norden, aye; Commissioner Bell, aye. The motion carried.

RESOLUTION REVOKING SPECIAL REVIEW USE PERMIT
SRU 99-04 KLOTZ KENNEL

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fremont County Board of County Commissioners (hereafter "Board"):

THAT WHEREAS, the Kennel License for Klotz Kennel expired in August 2012; and

WHEREAS, Sandra and Samantha Klotz (hereafter "Owners") were notified by the Department of Planning and Zoning (hereafter "Department") of the kennel license expiration; and

WHEREAS, a notice containing the date, time, location of the permit revocation meeting, and telephone number of the Department were mailed to the Owners, by certified mail return receipt to the Department (*letter unclaimed*); and

WHEREAS, the Department unsuccessfully attempted to notify the Owners of the kennel license expiration and permit revocation meeting by telephone; and

WHEREAS, the Owners have not communicated with the Department nor paid the kennel license inspection fee;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board that:

RESOLUTION FOR CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT
FILE NUMBER CUP 12-002 DORSEY ORCHARD PARK MINI-STORAGE FACILITY

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fremont County Board of County Commissioners (hereafter "Board")

THAT WHEREAS, Wesley E. Dorsey, (hereafter "Applicant") has made application for issuance of a Conditional Use Permit pursuant to Section 8.14 of the Zoning Resolution of Fremont County to allow the continued use of the existing mini-storage facility. Said application has been designated as file #**CUP 12-002 Dorsey Orchard Park Mini-Storage Facility**; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Fremont County Zoning Resolution previously adopted; the Planning Commission of Fremont County reviewed the application at its **December 4, 2012** regular meeting and the Planning Commission recommended **APPROVAL**; and

WHEREAS, a notice containing the specific request, proposed use, date, time, location of the public hearing, telephone number of the Department of Planning and Zoning (hereafter "Department") and a site plan and vicinity map were mailed fourteen (14) days prior to the public hearing, by certified mail, return receipt to the Department, to all property owners within five-hundred (500) feet of the boundaries of the subject parcel; and to appropriate agencies, in accordance with regulations; and

WHEREAS, a notice containing the specific request, proposed use, date, time, location of the public hearing, and telephone number of the Department where additional information may be obtained, was posted on the property fourteen (14) days prior to the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, a notice of the public hearing was published by the Department, in a newspaper of general circulation in Fremont County, fourteen (14) days prior to the public hearing, and which contained the specific request, time and place of the public hearing, and an explanation of the proposed use and its location; and

WHEREAS, the Board held a public hearing concerning said application on **January 8, 2013**, at which time comments and evidence were considered, including all materials contained as part of the application and which were in the County's file concerning the application; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the issuance of a Conditional Use Permit is appropriate;

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NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board that:

1. The Board did make the following findings with respect to the application for a Conditional Use Permit as follows:
 - a) The procedural requirements of Section 8.14 of the Fremont County Zoning Resolution have been met.
 - b) The location of the proposed use is compatible and harmonious with the surrounding neighborhood.
 - c) The proposed use will not have detrimental effect on property values.
 - d) The proposed site and use will not impair public health, welfare, prosperity and safety by creating undesirable sanitary conditions, overburdening of utilities or adverse environmental influences.
 - e) The site will be served by streets and roads of sufficient capacity to carry the traffic generated by the proposed use, and the proposed use will not result in undue traffic congestion or traffic hazards.
 - f) The site is of sufficient size to accommodate the proposed use together with all yards, open spaces, walls and fences, parking and loading facilities, landscaping and such other provisions required by this resolution.
 - g) The proposed use, if it complies with all conditions on which this approval is made contingent, will not adversely affect other property in the vicinity or the general health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the county, and will not cause significant air, water, noise or other pollution.
2. A Conditional Use Permit shall be issued contingent on the acceptance and observance by the Applicant of the following specified conditions:
 - A. The term of the Conditional Use Permit shall be for life of the use (*estimated as 50 plus years*).
 - B. The Department shall review the permit annually to determine compliance with the conditions of the permit and forward it to the Board for their review as required by regulations. It shall be the responsibility of the permit holder to provide the Department with copies of other permits, licenses, or other documentation showing compliance with the requirements of any other governmental agency (*to include items such as changes to the documents, updates, renewals, revisions, annual reports*). Further it shall be the responsibility of the permit holder to provide the Department with copies of any documents that would affect the use of the subject property, such as but not limited to updated or renewed leases for use of or access to the subject property. Copies of these documents shall be submitted to the Department prior to the anniversary date of the

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approval of the use permit each year. If the Department has to notify the permit holder that the anniversary date has passed and / or request said documentation, then a penalty fee shall be charged to the permit holder. If the required documentation and penalty fee are not submitted to the Department within twenty (20) days following notification to the permit holder, then violation procedures may be commenced, which could result in termination, revocation, rescission or suspension of the use permit.

- C. The Applicant shall conform to all plans, drawings and representations submitted with or contained within the application except as may be inconsistent with the other provisions of the permit.
- D. The Applicant shall comply with all laws and regulations of the County of Fremont, its agencies or departments, the State of Colorado, its agencies or departments and the United States of America, its agencies or departments, as now in force and effect or as the same may be hereafter amended.
- E. Applicants shall obtain, prior to operation, and keep in effect, throughout operation, all other permits, licenses or the like, including renewals, required by any other governmental agency and as otherwise may be required by Fremont County and shall provide copies of such to the Department. Revocation, suspension or expiration of any such other permits shall revoke, suspend or terminate the permit authorized hereunder, as the case may be.
- F. If a Conditional Use is abandoned, discontinued or terminated for a period of six (6) months, the approval thereof shall be deemed withdrawn, and the use may not be resumed without approval of a new application. Provided, however, if the holder of the permit intends to or does temporarily cease the special review use for six (6) months or more without intending to abandon, discontinue or terminate the use, the holder shall file a notice thereof with the Department prior to the expiration of the six-month period stating the reasons thereof and the plan for the resumption of the use. The requirement of a notice of temporary cessation shall not apply to applicants who have included in their permit applications a statement that the use would continue for less than six (6) months in each year and such fact is noted on the permit. In no case, however, shall temporary cessation of use be continued for more than two (2) years without approval by the Board of County Commissioners.
- G. If a Conditional Use Permit is to be transferred it shall comply with all applicable Federal, State and County regulations regarding such transfer.
- H. Days and hours of operation shall not be limited.
- I. The applicant shall provide to the Department, documentation from the Fremont County Weed Coordinator that the applicant has in place an acceptable weed control plan, further the applicant shall implement and maintain the plan, if required.

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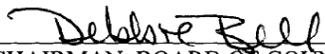
- J. The County shall retain the right to modify any condition of the permit, if the actual use demonstrates that a condition of the permit is inadequate to serve the intended purpose of the condition. Such modification shall not be imposed without notice and a public hearing being provided to the Applicant at which time applicant and members of the public may appear and provide input concerning the proposed modifications to the conditions of the permit.
- K. Notwithstanding the term for which this permit will be issued, the permit shall be subject to additional review by the Board of County Commissioners at its discretion and during any such review the Board may consider, if warranted in the judgment of the Board, imposition of the requirement of fencing and / or screening of the site. (Condition from CUP 92-13).
- L. Only the named party on the permit shall be allowed to operate this Conditional Use Permit. Board approval shall be required prior to allowing any other person or entity to operate at the site under the conditions of this permit. All persons, entities or others requesting Board approval to operate under this Conditional Use Permit must agree to abide by all terms and conditions of this Permit and shall be required to be named on this Permit as additional parties who are bound by the terms and conditions of this Conditional Review Use Permit.
- M. A Conditional Use Permit shall not be modified in any way without Department approval for Minor Modifications or approval of Major Modifications by the Board in accordance with Section 8.14 of the Fremont County Zoning Resolution (*complete reapplication*).

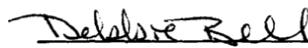

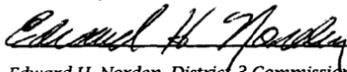

RESOLUTION NO. 10, SERIES OF 2013

RESOLUTION APPOINTING THE VETERAN'S SERVICE OFFICER

WHEREAS, the Fremont County Board of County Commissioners is authorized by C.R.S. §28-5-801-805 to establish a county veterans service office and to appoint a county veterans service officer for such county; and

WHEREAS, Betty Hanawalt, the Fremont County Veterans Service Officer appointed to a two-year term from two-year term beginning on January 10, 2012, and continuing through January 7, 2014, has resigned from her position as Veterans Service Officer, resulting in a vacancy in the position, effective January 31, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has advertised for interested applicants to fill the position of Veterans Service Office, has interviewed interested applicants and has sought the advice and counsel of the chief officer of each post of the regularly established and existing veterans organizations of Fremont County; and

WHEREAS, Albert Augustine has applied for the position and is well-qualified based on his education and experience to perform the duties of county veterans service officer; and

WHEREAS, the Fremont County Board of Commissioners and the chief officers of the regularly established and existing veterans organizations of Fremont County have reached consensus that Albert Augustine is the best candidate for the position; and

WHEREAS, the Fremont County Board of Commissioners is confident that Albert Augustine will successfully perform the duties and assuming the responsibilities of veterans service officer and should be appointed to serve in such position for the completion of the two-year term of Betty Hanawalt; and

WHEREAS, Albert Augustine is willing to accept and serve for the completion of the term from January 10, 2012 through January 7, 2014.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR THE COUNTY OF FREMONT, that Albert Augustine is hereby appointed to the office of Veterans Service Officer for the completion of the two-year term commencing January 10, 2012 and ending on January 7, 2014. The duties and responsibilities of the office shall be as set forth in Colorado State Statutes and as may be requested from time to time by the Board of County Commissioners. The effective date of the appointment shall be February 3, 2013.

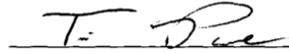

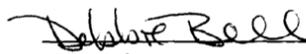
- WHEREAS, John C. Fremont was born on January 21, 1813, 200 years ago, in Savannah, Georgia; and
- WHEREAS, John C. Fremont became known as "The Great Pathfinder" because of his many exploratory expeditions surveying the Western territories; and
- WHEREAS, John C. Fremont compelled United States citizens to re-imagine the geographic breadth and the diversity of their nation; and
- WHEREAS, John C. Fremont is known as one of the more visionary figures in American history; and
- WHEREAS, John C. Fremont served as Second Lieutenant of Topographical Engineers in the United States Army, which enabled him to secure exploration assignments of the territories between the Mississippi Valley and the Pacific Ocean; and
- WHEREAS, John C. Fremont became a regular visitor to this area and became well known in the former local trading post town of Hardscrabble; and
- WHEREAS, John C. Fremont gave his name to many mountains, towns, libraries, counties, and parks, including our very own Fremont County, Colorado; and
- WHEREAS, John C. Fremont also gave his name to the local Fremont Peak, which overlooks the beautiful Cañon City, Colorado, area.

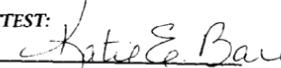
