

Public Health 2015 Accountability Report

- Working cooperatively with a local physician, Dr. Madeline Brown, Public Health began offering a travel clinic in Fremont County. The purpose of this clinic is to provide travel vaccines, disease information and travel advice to citizens traveling outside the US.
- By funding through Children's Hospital, Public Health began a testing clinic for HIV and HCV along with counseling to persons testing positive to these diseases. This clinic is offered free of charge to the public.
- Public Health was awarded a grant in the amount of \$25,000 through September of 2016 to increase awareness of chronic diseases and to map resources available within the county to treat these illnesses.
- Public Health issued 2,592 birth and death records in 2015.
- Public Health took over the administration of the county Medical Reserve Corps from St. Thomas More Hospital.
- Public Health provided 2,398 immunizations to the community including Hep B, DTaP, MMR, Tdap, PCV-13, Polio, Varicella, typhoid, HPV, and over 910 flu shots.
- Public Health provided CPR training to 74 people in 2015 and 16 people completed the Stepping On fall prevention class.
- Public Health operated an information booth at the Smokeout Event hosted by PCC.
- Public Health provided first aid support to a runner participating in the Rim to Rim event.
- Public Health provided toothbrushes, vaccine info, jump ropes, and preparedness info at the Child Health & Safety Fair.
